- **4**. After listening closely to the story of Fr Pat, how would you describe the 'life' around the 'favela'? Compare this to your own experience of growing up in Ireland.

- **10**. Fr. Pat does not impose himself or his ideas on the people. What do you think is meant by this approach to living and working in Brazil? Is it a good approach? Suggest an alternative approach.

- **11**. Throughout this radio documentary there have been some very interesting comments which speak of missionary life. Write about what you think it means to be a person of Faith/a Missionary in today's world.
- **12**. From your knowledge of the life of Jesus in the Gospel, find three stories that show that 'the importance of helping the poor' should remain central for all of us today.

CLASSROOM ACTION PROJECTS

- **13**. **Invite a Guest Speaker**; Bring in a guest speaker who will tell his/her story about working in the Developing World with the marginalised.
- **14**. **Prayer Service**: Create a Prayer Service in which you and your class pray for all missionaries working with people in need throughout the world.
- **15**. **Homeless in Ireland**. Contact 'Focus Ireland', and 'St. Vincent De Paul' and invite a speaker in to tell the class about those living on the streets in our towns and cities.
- 16. Songs: Divide into groups and choose a song that explores the plight of the marginalised. Taking the lyrics, find images that will suit and put them together in a Power Point Presentation. Using the song and Power-point together, take turns to make the presentation to your class.

- **9**. Write a note on your feelings while watching this documentary. What did you notice when you saw the different situations, which one affected you most and why?
- 10. Does Fr Paddy impress you as a person? As a person of faith? As a priest? Write a note on each of these aspects of Fr. Paddy. Which characteristic describes Fr. Paddy the most; A good person, a missionary, a person of faith or a good priest? And why?
- **11**. Fr. Paddy's approach to his work with the people. What do you think is meant by this approach to 'working with people'? Is it a good approach? What way would you like to work with people?

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GOING DEEPER STILL IN FAITH

- **12**. Throughout this film-documentary there have been some very interesting comments on the understanding of prisons and the treatment of prisoners. Take one or a number of these comments that you heard, and say whether you agree or disagree. Give reasons for your opinion?
- **13**. From your knowledge of the life of Jesus in the Gospel, find three stories that show that 'the importance of supporting those in need' should remain central for all of us today. e.g. Matthew 25.

CLASSROOM ACTION PROJECTS

- **14**. **Invite a Guest Speaker**; Bring in a guest speaker who will tell his/her story about working in the Developing World with the marginalised or working with people marginalised in Ireland.
- **15**. **Prayer Service**: Create a Prayer Service in which you and your class pray for all missionaries serving people in need throughout the world.
- **16**. **In Ireland**: Contact a group working with people in real need and invite a speaker in to tell the class about their work and why they are involved.
- 17. Songs: Divide into groups and choose a song that explores the plight of the marginalised. Taking the lyrics find images that will suit and put them together in a Power Point Presentation. Using the song and Power Point together, take turns to make the presentation to your class.
